

## **REPORT ON GOOD IN-KIND SENT BY MISSION WORLD AID INC.**

We are pleased to submit a distribution report on goods sent by the Mission World Aid Inc. to the Family Caregivers Association for the Aged Group (FCAAG) in Uganda. We extend our gratitude for providing this kind of support to the needy in our community through our organization. The aid which we received in terms of goods from your organization helped us to achieve our goal.

The Chairperson for Family Caregivers Association for the Aged Group, Mr. John Alfred Ejura is the person responsible for the distribution of the goods to the needy older persons. He is also working as interim coordinator for the organization.

We had a distribution meeting with leaders of older persons groups and the Executive Members of FCAAG in Lira town before distributions. Government officials were present during the distribution of goods.

The Aid/goods was distributed in Aboke sub county, Kole County, Apac District. The first distribution took place in Aboke Catholic parish; and the second distribution was done in Aboke Ginnery trading centre. The total number of people who received the goods is 1220 in Aboke Sub-county alone. In Lira district, the first distribution took place in Jinja Camp, Ojwina Division, Lira Municipality, and the second distribution in Lira took place in Aromo Walela, Aromo sub-county, Erute South Constituency, Lira District. Nine hundred (500) old persons in Lira District received clothes and some few of them received shoes, bags, books, pens and their local leaders received crockery.

Cameras, electrical items, fax machine, bicycles and others will be used by the organization. Some of the electrical items are not in working condition for e.g. Video camera (need battery), compact Disk player.

Computers and school furniture, and others will be given to Aboke Youth Vocational Technical School. Medical mattresses will be used by the organization in the proposed health centre for the organization (we are still keeping them in our store).

Aboke Catholic parish is headed by a parish priest called father Michael Abok. The goods were distributed inside the catholic mission; and during distribution, there were two Army men who helped so much in protecting the goods from being stolen from the needy older persons and orphaned children during distribution. People were many and we could not manage alone without the help of two army men even if the place is fenced. (See photo attached).

Four Health centre received medical items such as medical gowns, clinics. These health centers include: Aboke health centre IV, Aboke mission health centre II, Opetta health centre II, Aromo health centre III in Lira District respectively.

The Board of Directors of Family Caregivers Association for the Aged Group (FCAAG) offers deep appreciation and sincere thanks to mission world Aid INC and their supporters who offered materials and financial support for sending the aid/goods to our organization. We are also thankful to our volunteers, local activist and and above all Fr. Once again I would like to thank you for donating your time and resources to support the poor in our country Uganda Particularly in our community.
